

Martin Fowler phoned us to complain how he eventually arrived at Milton Keynes at 11.30 to find a event with hardly any of the advertised attractions, a crap stage, hardly any of the advertised DJ's and to top it all a finish of 6.00am instead of 8.00am - not a happy hector!

We have been informed that the promoter also did a runner from the event at around 2.00am leaving a queue of people waiting to be paid, the venue had only received a deposit, the DJ's and many more - he hasn't been seen since at time of press. The music was cut and The Sanctuary announced that they hadn't been paid at around 5.00 o'clock over the PA but they decided to continue with the music so show good faith to the people who had already been obviously fucked around - full respect must go to them for this.

After reading the flyer it seems the promoters of Vision were really taking the piss - comments like 'we have proved beyond doubt that Vision will deliver the goods' and 'Gone are the days when promoters can print false promises and still survive', how right they are!!!! Other comments that made me laugh were 'on this night history will be made', they got that right, and 'no other party will equal our production or our commitment', personally I can't see any other promoter wanting to equal an event such as this.
